Zach Blazier - Deacon candidate for Indy Reformed

I am Zach Blazier, 42 years old, never married, and without children. My upbringing took place in an Independent Fundamental Baptist home, where my involvement in church, attendance at a Christian school through 6th grade, and consistent participation in church camps and youth rallies were integral aspects of my life. Throughout my formative years, I made numerous professions of faith and countless "decisions" during altar calls. However, my commitment to the Christian faith was more about avoiding trouble and pleasing my parents than genuinely embracing a Christ-centered lifestyle. Following a two-year stint at Bob Jones University, I ran from God.



Around the age of 37, I became serious about studying the Bible, realizing I lacked a clear understanding of my beliefs. Simultaneously, my sister introduced charismatic beliefs to our family, creating a theological challenge. I knew I didn't agree and wanted to prove her wrong. While attempting to disprove her views, I made no headway but instead discovered historical creeds, doctrines of grace, church history, and hermeneutics—subjects previously unexplored in my 20 years of church and Bible college experiences. It was during this period of study that I believe I was genuinely saved by the grace of God. I no longer trusted the pressured professions of faith and recognized that my faith was a gift. This realization brought the conviction to not casually attend church but to actively join and serve.

My search for a biblical church home led me to Indy Reformed. While adapting to reformed worship required time, I found solace in receiving solid biblical exegesis to address my questions. Despite the initial unfamiliarity of certain practices, I committed myself to reading and studying Scripture to ensure alignment with biblical principles. Recognizing that this process would unfold over several months, I eagerly commenced my service by running sound and contributing to setup and teardown on Sundays. Through extensive reading, rigorous study, and learning from the insightful leadership at Indy Reformed, I developed a profound affection for the three forms of unity and the Ecumenical Creeds. This journey not only enriched my comprehension of Scripture but, most importantly, deepened my love for God and His Word.

As I contemplate deacon training and ponder the call to the diaconate, I find that my sense of calling extends beyond a specific office to a broader commitment to serve the church. While I am willing and enthused about the prospect of serving as a deacon, my commitment to the church goes beyond any official role, as I am dedicated to serving to the best of my ability in any capacity.
